Reflection for Sunday

Today is the first Sunday of Christian Aid week, a time in the year when we particularly remember that we are part of a global community – this year we are all going through the worldwide coronavirus pandemic, but we know that the world's poorest people are the most vulnerable to the crisis. They are less resilient, have less access to healthcare and the necessary resources and will be less able to weather the economic impact. For the last 75 years Christian Aid has stood alongside the world's poorest people, and as Christ's family we are also called to stand alongside our worldwide neighbours, sharing our resources our love and our prayers. Do make time this week to learn more about some current Christian Aid projects - from their website www.christianaid.co.uk or look at some of their stories on Youtube – just search Christian Aid Week 2020 – there you will find the stories of Rose coping with drought in Kenya and of Florence and her community, joyfully transformed as they work in partnership with Christian Aid to tackle climate change. These stories can inspire our prayers, our giving and changes in our behaviour as now more than ever we are aware of our worldwide neighbours.

“ Do not let your hearts be troubled” are the comforting words of Jesus in our Gospel reading set for today. They are spoken to the disciples in an unsettling time and have fresh resonance for us today in these challenging and unsettling COVID weeks. Likewise the promises of Jesus we find in this passage; they are often read as words of hope and reassurance at times of bereavement and loss, but they take on a new relevance for us in this time when we are experiencing an enforced “dwelling” in our own homes during lockdown. For some this has offered an opportunity to explore a deeper understanding of what it is to “dwell” in God's presence. For others who are juggling work, home-schooling, and separations or for those who are struggling with their own and others physical and mental ill-health there seems even less time to dwell with God – but we are all learning afresh that God does not dwell in our church buildings but dwells with us and within us. As the verses from 1 Peter 2 remind us - we are the living stones, being built into a spiritual house.

And perhaps Thomas' cry to Jesus in this passage, again echoes our own current cry – “we do not know the way”(v.5) We share Thomas' uncertainty because we don't know what lies ahead for us, but Thomas' cry invites us to be honest in prayer before God and honest with each other as we seek to find new ways forward and to follow Jesus in these exceptional times.

At St Mary's we often sing “ Let us build a house.....all are welcome” today, let's sing and pray this, not about our physical church buildings but about ourselves, living stones, being built into a spiritual house, where Love dwells and is lived out in our everyday actions.

*Let us build a house where love can dwell
And all can safely live,
A place where saints and children tell
How hearts learn to forgive.
Built of hopes and dreams and visions,
Rock of faith and vault of grace;
Here the love of Christ shall end divisions;
All are welcome, all are welcome, all are
welcome in this place.*

*Let us build a house where hands will reach
beyond the wood and stone
to heal and strengthen, serve and teach,
and live the Word they've known.
Here the outcast and the stranger
bear the image of God's face;
let us bring an end to fear and danger:
All are welcome, all are welcome, all are
welcome in this place.*
